Camp Saulding Sapelo fol. Oct 22 - 1861 Dear Wife This will informs, that I am well except a bourd complaint it is not bad otherways I am well father has been very sick but he is getting better Sa as to be about and attend to his business there are Several of the recruits sick five that Tolerable bad off although I do not think any are dangerous Some of the old company are sicke yet three pretty low & thought I would come home to day but there were so many going there was no chance for me I will come as soon as possible I hope In a few days of I know you had any body to Stay with you I would be better satisfied of you have notody with you pender must stay with of nights write to me by William I Somes and let me know how you are getting along I want to see you and the children very much yours in haste "W W Snight

Camp Spaulding Sapelo Island, Oct 23, 1861

Dear Wife,

This will inform you that I am well, except a bowel complaint. It is not bad otherwise. I am well. Father has been very sick but he is getting better, so as to be about and attend to his business. There are several of the recruits sick. Five that tolerable bad off although I do not think any are dangerous. Some of the old company are sick yet three pretty low. I thought I would come home today, but there were so many going there was no chance for me. I will come as soon as possible. I hope in a few days if I know you had any body[sic] to stay with you, I would be better satisfied. If you have nobody with you, Pender must stay with at nights. Write to me by William A. Jones and let me know how you are getting along. I want to see you and the children very much. Yours in haste,
