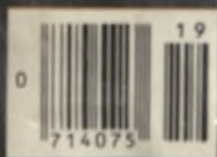

Protests Against Apartheid Hit U.S. College Campuses

Reminiscent of the movement that swept the country during the turbulent '60s, scores of students at college campuses across the country are sitting in and being locked up to protest investments of American firms in South Africa and the racially segregated apartheid system there.

Among the many protestors, students at Columbia University in New York remained on the front steps of the administration building for 10 days after padlocking the doors there to protest the university holding stock in South African companies. Students at the University of Cali-

fornia boycotted classes and were arrested to protest the divestiture policy of the U.C. school system. Other schools where students have participated in demonstrations against apartheid in South Africa include the University of Iowa, Georgetown University and the University of Massachusetts.

Nearly Half Of All U.S. Households Receive Aid

Almost half of all the households in the nation receive government benefits in some form, according to a Census Bureau report. More than 39 million households—46.7 percent of the total—were taking part in one or more government programs as of the first quarter of 1984.

School board winners were: Willie Rayford, Donald Williams and Minnie A. Martin. A year ago there were no Black elected officials. However, Alvin Payton was elected to the County Commission in November.
