





PRODUCTION STAFF

Lee Adams (Lyrics) began his career as a working journalist, having gained a Bachelor of Arts degree from Ohio State University, the later, a Master's degree from the Columbia School of Journalism in New York. He actively wrote songs for theatrical revues in New York and London. The first production where he teamed up with Charles Strouse was the musical, Bye Bye Birdie. Others include: All American, Golden Boy, and Applause, which was based on the movie screenplay All About Eve. In addition to his notable Broadway and London West End credits, Adams and Strouse, wrote a London musical, I and Albert, in 1972. Adams then became active in films and television. His theme for TVs long running All in the Family, titled "Those Were the Days," has been heard more often than any other television theme. He also wrote lyrics for The Night They Raided Minsky's. Among his prodigious output of songs, a number have become legitimate standards. These include "Put on a Happy Face," "Kids," "One Boy," "Applause," "Night Song," "Once Upon a Time," "This is Your Life," "You've Got Possibilities," "I Want to Be with You" and "A Lot of Living to Do."

Michael Stewart (Writer) earned a Master of Fine Arts degree in drama from Yale University and was a prolific writer of books and lyrics for the musical theater, often with Mark Bramble. Works include: I Love My Wife (1977), which he wrote the book and lyrics to the music of Cy Coleman; Barnum (1980), for which he wrote the lyrics to Bramble's book and Coleman's music, and 42nd Street, co-written with Bramble to the songs of Harry Warren and Al Dubin. He met Charles Strouse and Lee Adams in 1954 and began collaborating on "Let's Go Steady," a musical that strove to capture the spirit of a generation spellbound by Elvis Presley. The show went through several transformations, including a change of title to "The Day They Took Birdie Away." The show opened in New York in 1960 with the title Bye Bye Birdie. Strouse, Adams and Stewart all won Tony Awards for their contributions. Other credits include: Carnival, George M!, The Grand Tour, Hello, Dolly!, Mack and Mable and Bring Back Birdie.

Charles Strouse (Music) has composed for theater, film, and television; contributing music to Shoestring Review and "Born Too Late". He made his musical "book" debut with Bye, Bye Birdie. Other musicals on Broadway include All American, Golden Boy, It's a Bird ... It's a Plane ... It's Superman!, Applause, Annie, Rags, Nick and Nora, and Annie Warbucks; film scores include Bonnie and Clyde, The Night They Raided Minskey's, There Was a Crooked Man, and Just Tell Me What You Want; film compositions including Off Beat, Ishtar, All Dogs Go to Heaven, Jungle Fever, and Year of the Comet; author of anthology shows By Strouse, 1977, and A Lot of Living, 1998; composer of music for television, including All in the Family, The Worst Witch, and HBO Storybook Musicals.

Paula Hammons Sloan (Director/Choreographer) Past Windwood Productions tours include Little Women, Urban Cowboy, Gentlemen Prefer Blondes, Seven Brides for Seven Brothers, The Unsinkable Molly Brown and Barry Manilow's Copacabana. Ms. Sloan has directed and/or choreographed numerous other National tours including: My One and Only, Funny Girl, George M, Titanic, Crazy For You and Mame. She recently served as choreographer of the production of Singin' in the Rain, Jekyll and Hyde and also 42nd Street for the Trump Plaza Hotel and Casino Broadway Series in Atlantic City. Other credits include Plan B Productions - Los Angeles, West Virginia Public Theatre, Gateway Playhouse, the Houston Symphony, Surflight Theatre and Theatre Under the Stars - Houston,TX. 




