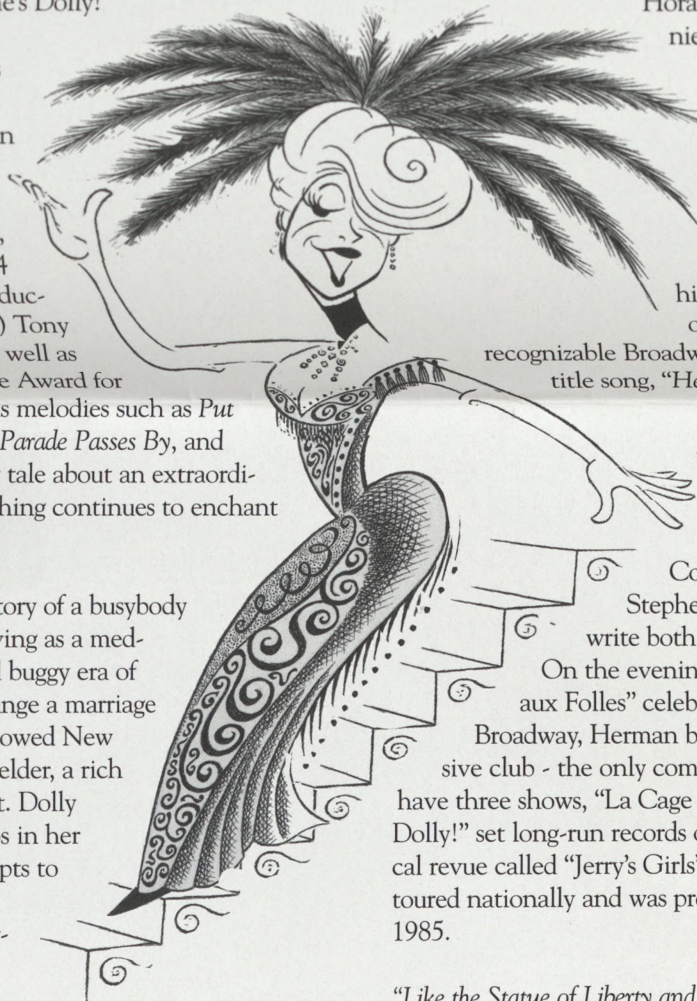

She sets out to arrange a marriage between Irene Molloy, a lovely widowed New York milliner, and Horace Vandergelder, a rich curmudgeon of a Yonkers merchant. Dolly leaves a whirlwind of merry mix ups in her wake as midway through her attempts to play Cupid she decides to grab this "Yonkers half-a-millionaire" for herself!

Announcing "I'm gonna get some life

back into my life," Dolly proceeds with her scheme to snare Horace. Along the way she liberates the niece he tyrannizes and the employees he oppresses, all in a gloriously mixed up night-on-the-town at New York's Harmonia Gardens. In one of the greatest production numbers in the history of musical comedy, Dolly is welcomed back to her old haunts by the Garden's hilarious maitre d', Rudolph, and all the other employees with one of the most recognizable Broadway melodies ever written - the rousing title song, "Hello, Dolly!"

Jerry Herman was only 29 when he scored his first Broadway success with a musical called "Milk and Honey" in 1963. Like Irving Berlin, Cole Porter, Meredith Willson and Stephen Sondheim, he is one of the few to write both the words and the music for his songs. On the evening of March 25, 1987, when "La Cage aux Folles" celebrated its 1500th performance on Broadway, Herman became the only member of an exclusive club - the only composer in the history of Broadway to have three shows, "La Cage aux Folles," "Mame," and "Hello, Dolly!" set long-run records of over 1500 performances. The musical revue called "Jerry's Girls" featuring his music and lyrics has toured nationally and was produced on Broadway in December, 1985.

Main Gallery Exhibit:

Dick Bjornseth, Assistant Professor of Art at Valdosta State University, will share the main galleries with Pam Bullard. Opening with a reception Monday, January 24th, 5 - 7PM, their exhibit will remain up until February 29th. Born in Chicago in 1948, Bjornseth spent most of his adult life in Houston, Texas, where he attended the Glassel School of Art, Houston Museum of Fine Arts. While working as a professional urban planner for the first half of his life, he created numerous drawings and paintings. He was drawn to the Southern climes of West Palm Beach, Florida, in 1987, and took painting classes at Florida Atlantic University. Returning to college in the early '90's, he earned a Masters in Fine Arts from Florida State University and is currently a doctorate candidate in Arts Administration. Bjornseth is best known for his light-hearted imagery and drawing. He received the Florence Award in 1995 from FSU and taught studio art in Florence, Italy. He has exhibited in and been represented by galleries in Georgia, Florida, Arizona, Texas and North Carolina. Currently he runs a Sunday afternoon for artists, drawing from life, 1:30-3:30 PM, every Sunday at L/VAC.

Front Gallery: Pam Bullard received her Bachelor of Fine Arts Degree from VSU (Magna Cum Laude) in 1997 with a focus in Printmaking and Computer Aided Graphic Design. Currently employed by Colson Printing Company as a Graphic Designer, Ms. Bullard's art reflects a broad spectrum of art styles and subject matter. Formerly employed as the Marketing Director and Gallery Curator of the Colquitt County Arts Center in Moultrie, Georgia, she handled publicity, publication design, installation, shipping and booking of exhibitions, and organized gallery talks and tours. Even at her young age, she brings with her the knowledge of traditional fine art printing processes including relief, intaglio, lithography, silk screening and monoprinting, photography and black and white film processing. Ms. Bullard studied watercolor and photography in London, England, and has taught classes at L/VAC in matting and framing. She has exhibited her work extensively, including a one-person show in L/VAC's Hall Gallery last year and was also selected as one of the featured artists in Colson Printing Company's prestigious calendar.

Hall Gallery: Linda Deater graduated in 1979 with honors from Miami Dade Community College with a degree in Fine Arts. Since 1981, she has owned and operated Rainbow's End Art Supplies in Live Oak, Florida. Deater was recipient in 1991 of the 28th Live Oak Woman's Club and Jr. Woman's Club Judges Award. Other awards and exhibits include: Selection for Colson Calendar (1998), Honorable Mention, mixed media competition in Slidell, Louisiana, "Spring Into Art" Exhibit (juried portion) at L/VAC and many others.

HELLO DOLLY - A BRIEF HISTORY

"Hello, Dolly!" opened in New York on January 16, 1964, and became an instantaneous blockbuster hit. Critics extolled it to the skies -- but still not enough. They called it belittlingly "The best musical of the season," little realizing that it would come to be recognized as the best musical of the decade, or longer. And, of course, the lines of would-be ticket-buyers lined up day after day, rarely less than 150 in a line at one time, begging for tickets for the nearest available performance - six months later. Mail orders poured in from people all over the world who were anticipating a trip to New York months later.

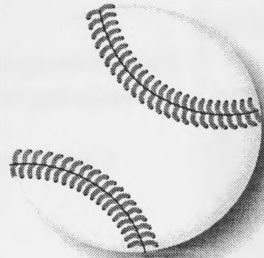

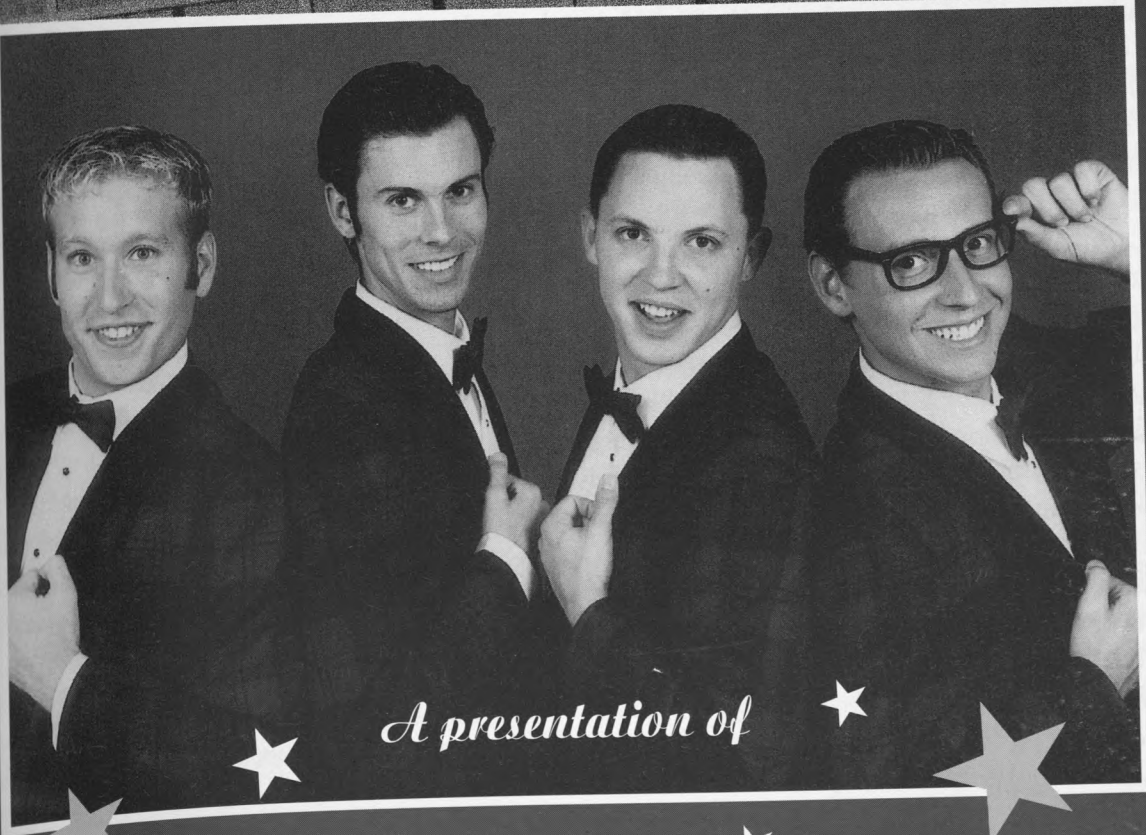

"I Can't Believe It!"

**Julianna Howard
L/VAC's Education Chairman**

"I can't believe it," is a phrase that Julianna Howard has used more times than once these past seven years that she's served as the Arts Commission Board's Education Chairman. She said the words most vehemently at the Community Partners In Education awards ceremony and banquet, sponsored by Griffin LLC, Sears, First State Bank & Trust, and *The Valdosta Daily Times*. As the Hahira Middle School's nominee, Julianna Howard as L/VAC's representative, was awarded Volunteer of the Year. "Winners were nominated by schools but were selected by non-local judges across Georgia," said Janeen Josey, CPI system coordinator for Valdosta City Schools.

Julianna, wife of dermatologist, Dr. Rick Howard, a tireless soccer sponsor and coach, is following in the footsteps of her educator/coach father, Thomas H. Rider, of Madison, Georgia, recently deceased. "Julianna was interested in helping every child have a better school experience. She saw a need and filled it," says Roberta George, L/VAC's Executive Director. "Many people wanted live performances in the schools, but Julianna was willing to do the hard work it took to schedule and find funding for these programs. She spent countless volunteer hours to bring GMT Productions (a touring company out of Rome, Georgia.) into the different auditoriums, cafeterias, and gyms in Lowndes and the surrounding five county area. In the 1998-99 school year, over 18,000 students saw a professional, live performance brought into their school, which meant small audiences that could see and hear every word with no loss of time out of the school day for travel or money spent on busses."

"It's a different avenue of learning as opposed to textbooks, paper, and pencils," says Julianna, who also started and works with the Academic Bowl at Hahira Middle School. "The principals, teachers, and teachers' aides are especially glad to see what they're trying to get across to students done in a different way." Julianna and Rick have four sons, Bill and Tom, both graduates of Duke University, and Jim and Ben, students at Lowndes High School.

Generating individual, civic, and corporate sponsorship, Julianna has achieved her goal that no child is excluded from seeing the programs. L/VAC's Center Exhibits:

Main Gallery:

On October 2, approximately 350 people came together for **Irony, Wilby Coleman's Exhibit** of metal sculpture. Mr. Coleman is already well-known throughout Georgia, having had numerous one-man and multiple artists' shows, but this one-man exhibit is a first for L/VAC. The Main Gallery floor bloomed with over 35 different and intriguing uses of old farm equipment, tempered steel, odds and ends, and just plain junk. Music was furnished by the Comptones, Smokin' Grass and Mr. Coleman himself. It was a great party!

Mr. Coleman's work is truly unique, using classical literary references to name the work as well as clever plays on words. "Half the fun is hearing the story that goes with each piece" said Gretchen McCoy at the reception. "Mower 'n Just An Owl" (a realistic owl made out of mower parts), "Travels With My Ant" (a long-tongued ant eater goes after an ant, "Gone But Not Forgotten" (a metal tribute to extinct birds), and "Foot Soldiers" (size 13 iron feet, welded to octagonal posts and anvils, carry arms and shields; the names are an intrinsic part of enjoying the pieces. "The many shadows cast by the sculpture onto the white walls of the gallery adds another interesting facet to the work," said Adann-Kennn Alexxandar, conducting a tour for the Ora-Lee West Homes' children.

Mr. Coleman's work will be up until November 12, with a change-out of 15 different pieces every two weeks, giving the Center an almost entirely new exhibit. **Don't forget to come back and see the new work!**

Hall Gallery: Twenty-five Years of Painting with Nell

A retrospective exhibit of the art work of **Nell Kirkland Johnson**, currently an art instructor with ABAC's Public Service Program.
