

PROFILES

George Gershwin(Music)

George Gershwin was born in Brooklyn on September 26, 1898, and began his musical training when he was 13. At 16 he quit high school to work as a "song plugger" for a music publisher and soon he was writing songs himself. "Sawanee," as introduced by Al Jolson, brought George his first real fame and led to his writing a succession of 22 musical comedies, most with lyrics by his older brother, Ira. the Gershwin's shows include Lady, Be Good!; Oh, Kay!; Strike Up the Band; Girl Crazy; and the Pulitzer Prize-winning Of Thee I Sing. From his early career George had ambitions to compose serious music. These ambitions were realized in some of his masterpieces of American music, among them "Rhapsody in Blue," "Concerto in F," "An American in Paris" and Second Rhapsody." In the late '20s George became fascinated by the Dubose Heyward novel Porgy, recognizing it as a perfect vehicle for opera using jazz and blues idioms. George's "folk opera" Porgy and Bess opened in Boston on September 30, 1935, and had its Broadway premiere two weeks later. In 1937 George was at the height of his career. In Hollywood, working on the score of The Goldwyn Follies, he collapsed and on July 11 died of a brain tumor. He was not quite 39 years old.

Ira Gershwin (Lyrics)

The first song writer to be awarded the Pulitzer Prize, was born in New York City on December 6, 1896. In 1917 The Evening Sun published his first song lyric (You May Throw All the Rice You Desire but Please Friends, Throw No Shoes"). Four years later Ira enjoyed his first major stage success, Two Little Girls in Blue, written with another Broad and newcomer, Vincent Youmans. In 1924 Ira and his brother, George, created the smash hit Lady, Be Good! and to continue their remarkable collaboration through a dozen major stage scores, producing such standards as a sting Rhythm," "The Man I Love," "S Wonderful," "Embraceable You," "I Got Rhythm," "But Not for Me" and ars far too numerous to mention. During his long career, Ira also enjoyed productive collaborations with such ers as Harold Arlen, Vernon Duke, Kurt Weill, Burton Lane and Jerome Kern, with whom he created his greatest of any one year, "Long Ago and Far Away." Ira Gershwin died on August 17, 1983, in Beverly Hills California.

Ke Ludwig(Author)

Ken I dwig received a Tony Award nomination for writing Crazy for You. He was also nominated for a Tony Award for his play Lend Me a Tenor. Lend Me a Tenor has proved to be one of the most popular comedies of the past decade and has received more than 200 productions world-wide. For television, Mr. Ludwig co-wrote the 1990 Kennedy Center Honors for CBS. He has recently completed a television pilot for Carol Channing. Mr Ludwig was born in York, Pennsylvania, and was educated at Havorford College, Harvard Law School and Cambridge University. He is Of Counsel with the law firm Steptoe and Johnson, is on the Board of Trustees of the Shakespeare Theatre at the Folger and is a member of the Artists Committee of the Kennedy Center Honors. He is married to Adrienne George and has a new daughter, Oliva.



Synopsis

Rich and poor, young and old, they came from the four corners of the earth to board the modern wonder of the world. The jeweled and the jaded, the aesthetes and the athletes, the maids and the millionaires, the anonymous and the infamous, the down-at-heel and the upper crust, all of

them destined for a landmark crossing. They traveled faster than man had ever traveled before, from one continent to another, surrounded by such opulence as to make Versailles blush, spurred by a tycoon determined to break the record for speed, captained by a trusted veteran of the high seas. Every one of them hoped they were bound not just for America, but for history. They were.

The name of the vessel: TITANIC. Now a new Broadway musical about the collision of man; compromise, compliance, greed -- and naturally speed, visibility, ice -- in a tragedy so avoidable, the fact that it occurred remains mind-boggling, heart-breaking... and the stuff of legend. Written by Academy Award and Tony Award-winner Peter Stone ("1776," "Woman of the Year," "My One and Only," "Will Rogers Follies"). With music and lyrics by Tony Award-winner Maury Yeston ("Nine, "Grand Hotel").

Onstage, amidst a lavish physical production, we come to know three



ordinary Seamen -- a stoker, a lookout and a radioman. We meet three others, rather more Uncommon - the owner, the builder and the captain. We thrill to the backdrop of grandeur and glamour that made every American multi-millionaire reserve a first-class stateroom; each merchant, professional and social-climbing tourist in second-class feel part of the event of the century every emigrant in steerage enjoy, for the first time in their lives, four full days of leisure. For those four days, life was carefree, the crossing perfectly smooth, the passengers increasingly eager for their arrival in New York. Then came Sunday, April 14th.

It was a cold, crystal clear night. The stars reflected diamonds off the black Atlantic. People bundled overcoats over their evening clothes to enjoy the brisk slap of suddenly frigid air sweeping the promenade deck. Inside the first class ballroom, the crystal chandeliers bathed dancers in a golden glow as the band played on, and in the club room, the men warmed to card games and cognac, surrounded by statues of the gods, swathed in the smoke of expensive cigars. On the second and third class decks, most had retired for the night. Many were asleep, lulled by the gentle heaving of the enormous engines and boilers, as they cut their record-breaking path through the water. It was late, almost midnight, when one loan lookout saw the ice. 45 seconds later came the jolt.

If the owner hadn't determined to surprise America by arriving a night early. If the builder had designed the watertight bulkheads to rise to a higher deck. If they hadn't cut the corner on an area of ocean they knew had been dangerous before. If it had been summer instead of spring. If the lookout's binoculars hadn't been missing from the crow's nest. If only one of these things had not been the case, TITANIC would today be the very definition of luxury, romance and fortitude, of bigger-faster-stronger, of progress victorious.

Instead, 19th century civilization, with its corseted morality, its extravagant codes of honor and sacrifice, its unswerving belief that God favored the rich, plunged that night to the bottom of the sea, aboard the largest moving object on earth.

TITANIC. In 1912, it left England, bound for New York and history. This spring, it arrived.
