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

GEORGE GERSHWIN (1898-1937) born in Brooklyn, New York on September 26, 1898, began his musical training at thirteen. in 1924, when George teamed up with his older brother Ira, "The Gershwins" became the dominant Broadway songwriters, creating such musical comedy hits such as Lady, Be Good! (1924), Oh, Kay! (1926), Funny Face (1927) and Of Thee I Sing (1931), the first musical comedy to win a Pulitzer Prize. Starting with his early days as a composer of songs, Gershwin had composed classics such as "Rhapsody in Blue" (1924), "Concerto in F" (1925) and "An American in Paris" (1928). The Gershwins' Porg ABess brothers' (co-written with DuBose and Dorothy Heyward and Ira Gershwin) was the Gers -cident.
