New center makes stronger commitment to children's art

ozens of sea creatures swim through the air, stationed beside of underwater plant life that glistens under gallery lights. These are not real fish, but fantastical representation's of a sea environment, presented as part of an exhibit by local artist and art teacher Walter Hobbs' Hahira Middle School students.

Housed in an area named for the executive director of the Lowndes/Valdosta Arts Commission and the Annette Howell Turner Center for the Arts, the Roberta George Gallery is filled with works by the Hahira Middle School

students (see "Gallery" box on this page for more exhibit details).

Though LVAC has long been committed to involving local and area youths in art, the Roberta George Gallery, which is assigned as a children and youth gallery, emphasizes the art commission's and its new art center's increased dedication to youth and children's arts. LVAC has long been a friend to art for youngsters. It has, and continues, to sponsor art classes for youths and children, as well as present several youth-related art shows annually. However, unlike LVAC's former headquarters at 1204 N. Patterson St., the Annette Howell Turner Center for the Arts, 527 N. Patterson St., allows the art commission to present continuous art exhibits by and for area youngsters. The new art center's increased space also ends the constant worry of a child's smudged finger-painting print finding its way onto the expensive canvas of an exhibited artist. The old center housed children's art classes in the same room as major gallery exhibits. In addition to the children's gallery, the new center has separate space, away from the galleries, dedicated to children's art

The children's gallery is one of several galleries offering simultaneous exhibits in the Annette Howell Turner Center for the Arts. For the young and old alike, a visitor can view the works of local children in the Roberta George Gallery, while journeying through the center's other galleries to see the prize-winning works of numerous local and regional artists from the "Spring Into Art" show, view an internationally flavored exhibit of African art as part of the center's permanent collection, view the diverse works of three North Florida artists and see several masterworks of the late artist Lamar Dodd.

In perspective of the entire art center's offerings, the children's gallery allows adults and children to witness how artists develop from the early works of youths to the mature capabilities of a master. It demonstrates how art can shapes lives from an early age to an individual's golden years.

Walter Hobbs' Hahira Middle School students exhibit is on display, Annette Howell Turner Center for the Arts, 527 N. Patterson St. Run dates: Continues through June 13. Public art mural session planned for tonight

VALDOSTA — Anyone who has ever wanted to be an artist or have a hand in helping to prepare a community work of art has the opportunity this evening to make such a dream come true.

Earlier this spring, Boys & Girls Club youths, the Annette Howell Turner Center for the Arts, the area Public Art Advisory Committee and artist-in-residence Marty Haythorn have been building the region's history from

the beginning of time to now.

Haythorn, a Thomasville artist, has created

a mosaic time-travel design that explores the region's past from the eras of small-celled organisms to dinosaurs to Native Americans to the current age.

A National Endowment of the Arts' Arts Engagement in American Communities grant funds the effort.

Boys & Girls Club members have been preparing the work which uses tiles, broken-plate pieces, ceramics, and created iconography to tell Valdosta's tale. And everyone can partici-

pate in telling this story.

This public art project invites the public on specific assigned dates through the spring and summer months to participate in constructing

the 14-1/2-foot-long by 3-1/2- to 4-foot-high installation of four connected panels.

Once it's completed, organizers hope to install the work in Downtown Valdosta or some other public place where the entire town and visitors can see the work.

Haythorn hopes to include a plaque bearing the names of all participants who helped create

the artwork.

The public sessions are scheduled for 6-8
p.m. today; 9:30 a.m.-noon Saturday, June 14; 6-8
p.m., June 17; 6-8 p.m., June 19, Hudson Building Ceramic Studio, across the street from the
Annette Howell Turner Center for the Arts.



Local poet headlines art center's Open Mic Night

VALDOSTA — Dr. Manuel Tovar, Valdosta, is scheduled to read from his new book during this weekend's Open Mic Night at the Annette Howell Turner Center for the Arts.

"Of Time and Space Divided" is Tovar's third book of poetry. As a young man, he often published poetry in the two newspapers of his native Monterrey, Mexico. "Tenuidades," his first book of poetry was published by the University of Nuevo Leon. His second book was "Under the Moon: Poems of Love and Other Follies." His two early works are out of print.

But not "Of Time and Space." Along with Manuel Tovar's more recent poems are illustrations by his son, Miguel Tovar. The book is available at the local Books-A-Million and the Annette Howell Turner Center for the Arts. This weekend's reading is sponsored by the art center and the local Snake Nation Press.



DR. MANUEL TOVAR

Born in Monterrey, Tovar was "schooled in the old country ways of courtesy and respect and love of family and place," according to information from Snake Nation Press. He studied medicine at the Universidad de Nuevo Leon. He became an MD through the Missouri State Board in 1960 and became a naturalized American citizen in 1964.

In 1973, he moved to Valdosta, where he practiced medicine for many years. He and wife Diane raised their family here. On Tuesdays and Thursdays, Tovar volunteers at the Migrant Workers Clinic, Lake Park. He is also involved with the writing seminars at the art center, 2-4 p.m. Saturdays.

Bob Berky was subsequently asked to join Montanaro's company of nine performers in the formation of the Celebration Mime Theatre. For For three years he performed and danced with the company at schools, universities, and theaters throughout Eastern and Midwestern United States and Canada.

atre. Returning to Rochester as a research assistant involved in a study of emotionally disturbed children, he then created and directed the Rochester Children's Theatre which toured area schools. Further mime training followed at Cornell University with Paul Curtis, director of the American Mime Theatre, and in 1973 Bob moved to Maine to begin study with Tony Montanaro, a contemporary of Marcel Marceau

Bob Berky began work as a soloist in 1976 and has since toured his solo clown/mime concert, "Foolsfire," at colleges and theaters throughout the United States, Great Britain, Ireland and Australia. He has performed at the Festival of the American Mime (1978, 1979), the Edinburgh Festival in Scotland (1977-79), the Jerusalem Festival in Israel (1979), the London Mime Festival (1979, 1980), the Belfast Festival in Northern Ireland, and the Perth Festival in Australia.

At present, Bob Berky, in addition to touring, serves as Artistic Director of the MIMEworkshop, a regional mime theatre based in Rochester, New York.

Over the years Bob Berky has created and participated in a number of special projects. These have included performing Stravinsky's L'Histoire du Soldat with the Corpus Christi Symphony in Texas, Copland's Rodeo with the Rochester Philharmonic, and Peter and the Wolf with the Grand Rapids Symphony. Bob has also written and produced a show specifically for planetarium viewing, entitled A Fool in the Universe. He recently finished two PBS special programs which will be televised nationally during 1980-81. Bob, along with Fred Garbo, also teaches an annual intensive workshop in clowning, now in its seventh year, in North Turner, Maine.

Bob Berky is the recipient of a National Endowment for the Arts Fellowship for 1980 and was awarded the coveted Fringe First Award at the 1979 Edinburgh Festival.

Once asked about the origin of his interest in mime, Bob responded: "A friend of mime talked me into doing a little mime skit in a show with him - the tug-of-war routine, where both players pretend to be in a tug-of-war with an imaginary rope. The routine was that he'd wind up off stage and I'd wind up at the end onstage by the curtain. I didn't know much about it then and I was very clumsy. We started the skit, he disappeared into the wings and I stumbled. I'll never forget it. I fell flat on my face in the middle of the stage and it hurt. When I looked up, I discovered that I was still holding onto the imaginary rope. I said to myself, 'Hey, this is pretty powerful stuff.'"




