HELLO TO ALL!

It is that time again, and the 2005 Colson Printing Company calendar has taken on new life. For starters we have increased the size, and we have been blessed with beautiful art from the 2004 Spring Into Art Exhibition. Special thanks to The First State Bank and the Annette Howell Turner Center for hosting the event. Every year the exhibit grows and the art just keeps getting better. If you have not visited the new art center you are missing a real treat.

For more than 10 years we have produced this calendar to be given to The Center for the Arts and our cherished customers. Without our loyal customers this calendar would not be possible. So the ultimate thanks is given to the customers of Colson Printing Company. Thank you!

In case you did not have the opportunity to see the art in the 2004 Spring Into Art Exhibit, the images printed in this calendar are just a small sampling of the art that was on display. Congratulations to the winners! Don't forget to mark your calendar to attend next year's show.

For those of you who have ink in your blood, here is how the calendar was produced. First, the originals were brought to our studio and the images were captured using a digital scan back camera. This is the same process we use to scan fine art originals in our Fine Art Division. Once the images were scanned and color corrected, they were placed in Quark Express and the design process was in full swing. After the copy was approved and the design complete, the pages were ripped and the plates were made for our Five Color Heidelberg 40" printing press. Now the fun begins... The cover was printed 4 up on 28x40 Satin Cover using process color ink and aqueous coating. The inside pages were printed on 28x40 Satin Text with one 16 page signature and one 8 page work and turn making 24 numbered pages. After printing, the sheets were trimmed, folded, and then stitched on our automatic gathering saddle stitcher. Finally the calendars were drilled and boxed for mailing and delivery.

That's it, one more project completed and on to the next one. Hopefully it will be yours! Have a great 2005.

The Annette Howell Turner Center for the Arts is a 17,000 square foot facility at 527 North Patterson Street in Valdosta, Georgia. The Turner Center for the Arts opened in April 2003. New exhibits are displayed every six weeks in four of the galleries. Works by local, regional, national and international artist are featured as well as works from area schools in the Children's Gallery. The fifth gallery is dedicated to the center's permanent East African Art Collection donated by Jerry Tillman.

In addition to the Visual Arts arena, the Turner Center for the Arts brings four nationally touring Broadway

performances to Mathis City Auditorium each year. The 2004-2005 season includes: *In the Mood*, *Fiddler on the Roof*, *Legends of Rock 'N Roll*, and *Stand by Your Man*. The Turner Center also brings children's performances for area schools. The 2004-2005 season includes: *Alice in Wonderland*, *The Emperor's New Clothes*, and *A Midsummer Night's Dream*.

The Turner Center has several classrooms where art classes of all types, all media, and for all ages are ongoing. Culinary classes are offered in the center's new state-of-the-art kitchen and feature international and

continental cuisine. Yoga classes are offered weekly and are free to the public.

The Turner Center for the arts hosts "Spring Into Art" each April which is an exhibition in which over 200 artists participate. All entered pieces are exhibited for a month and the juried pieces are exhibited in the Best of Spring Into Art. Selections are also made by the Colson Printing Company staff for the Colson Calendar.
