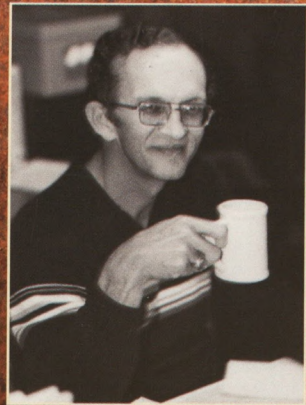

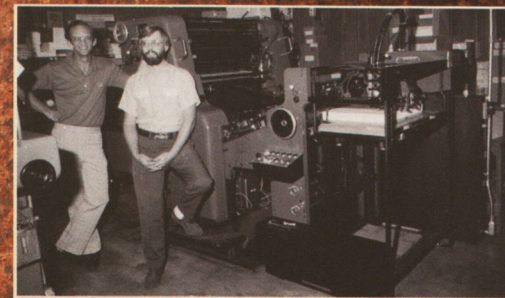

# To our loyal customers and friends,

**W**ell, we did it! Colson Printing Company has reached another milestone. This will be our 50th year in business!

First and foremost, we would like to thank all of our current and past employees, our families and friends, suppliers, bankers, accountants, and especially you, our cherished customer. 50 years did not come easily and we could not have achieved this without you and the blessings of the good Lord. A sincere thanks to you!

In 1962, the company started as a small commercial printing shop located at Georgia Christian School in Dasher, Georgia. Wally Colson, a biology teacher at the school and now president of Colson Printing, purchased the printing facility from the school and moved it to Valdosta, Georgia. In 1969, Colson purchased Service Printing Company and took over their location on Ann Street, merging the two businesses. This gave Colson Printing additional equipment, a better location and a larger customer base. In 1973, growing yet again, a prime corner lot in Valdosta was bought and a 5,000 square foot building erected. Today this location at 711 North Oak Street has a total of 43,000 square feet.

In 1983, Wendy Colson, the owner's son, began working at the company in the sales department. Recognizing a need for fine art reproductions in the Southeast, Wendy started printing for artists and publishers. Colson Art Printing now serves accounts nationwide and is known as one of the premier fine art printing

companies in America. In 1989, Production Printers in Valdosta was purchased, again increasing equipment and accounts. Several years later, the pre-press department was upgraded with the newest Mac and PC imagesetting equipment. 1994 brought a sizable expansion to Colson Printing Company in order to house a five color 28"x40" Heidelberg press and a 19"x25" four color perfecter Heidelberg press. Also included in the expansion was additional floor space for the art reproduction division. Later upgrades and expansions included a modern digital studio for capturing fine art, an expanded Inkjet printing department, Xerox Digital Presses, a 40" Bobst Die Cutter, and a framing and finishing department for fine art and large format posters and prints.

Finally, we would like to thank the Turner Center for the Arts and the selected artists for allowing us to use their images in this calendar. This will be our 20th year producing these beautiful calendars for our loyal customers and friends.

Thanks again to all of you who have made Colson Printing a 50 year old company.

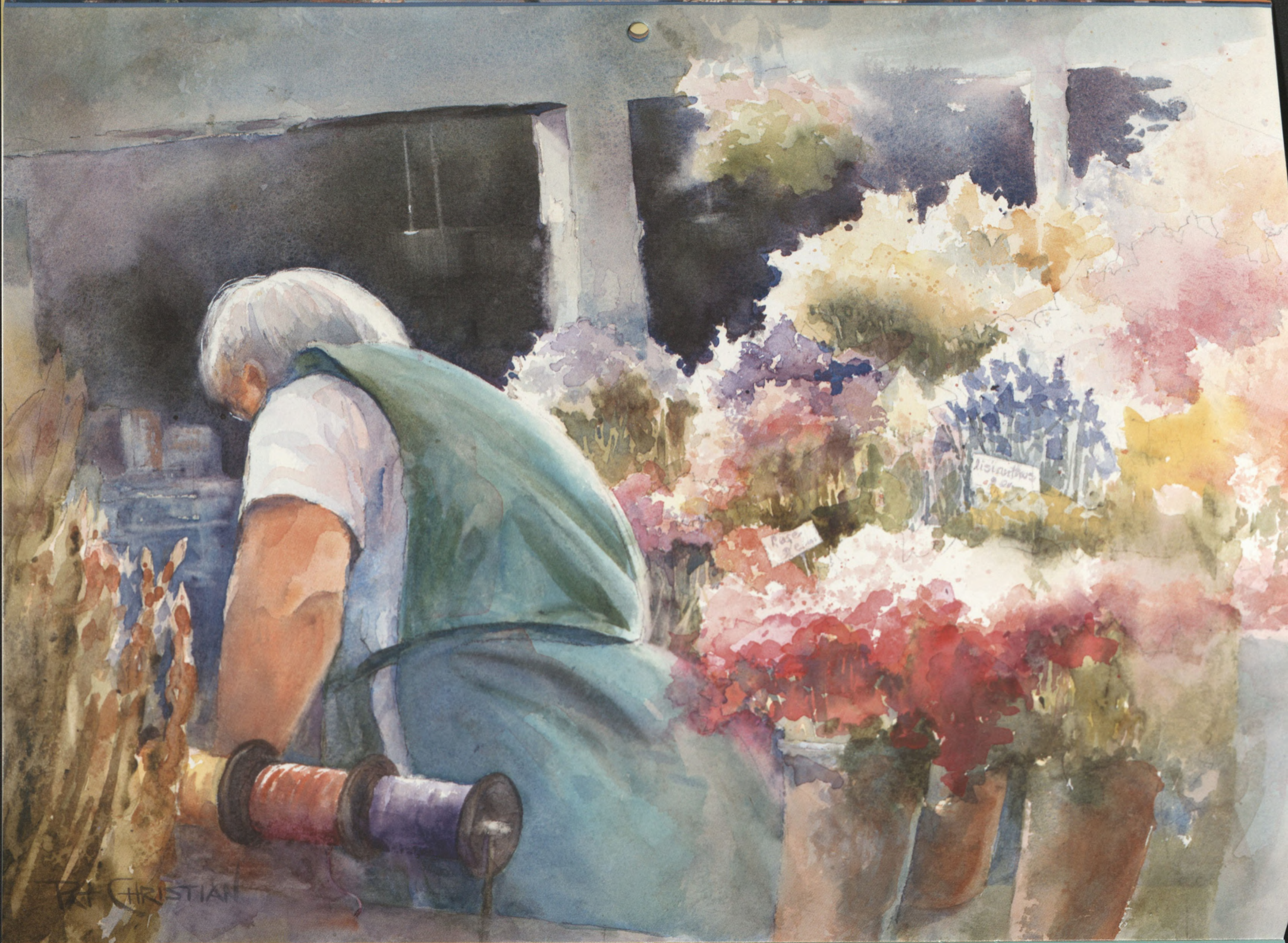
