Our Company was founded in 1909 in Cairo,

Georgia, by Ira Higdon, Sr. Back then groceries were delivered from a 6,000 square foot warehouse located behind the old depot on First Avenue Southwest. We used a horse drawn dray for our local deliveries, and all out-of-town orders were shipped by rail. This inbound freight was delivered on the old P&H Railroad, and in those early days, five employees kept everything running smoothly.




Ira Higdon, Jr. joined the Company in 1935, and served as president until 2000. Under his guidance, the business grew. A new warehouse facility was completed in 1946. The new building was twice the size of our original warehouse. In all, this 12,000 square feet facility was expanded three times and when completed totaled 60,000 square feet.


Larry Higdon joined the company in 1972, and together with his father helped to bring even greater growth to the business. In 1975, a new 100,000 square foot distribution center was completed on Alton Hall Road. With our continued growth, the distribution facility had to keep up. In 1981, a new expansion increased the size by 45,000 square feet. A new refrigerated dock and meat cooler were added in 1991, and an additional meat freezer was

added in 1996. Today, our Alton Hall Road facility spans over 165,000 square feet.

Larry Higdon was named president in 2000.

His son, Nat Higdon joined the company in 1998. He is the fourth generation of the family to make this distribution company their career. Nat was promoted to Vice President and Secretary in 2000.
