## LOCAL COLORED CITIZEN PASSED AWAY WEDNESDAY

The many friends, both white and colored, of Henry Horton Holder, were sorry to hear of his death, which occurred at his home here at 200 sixth Ave., N. E., at 7 a. m. \* Wednesday March 21, after an illness of two weeks. His death was due to old age and influenza.

The funeral service will be held at the Bethlehem A. M. E. Church, Sunday afternoon with his pastor in charge.

The deceased was born 83 years ago in Dougherty County, but had spent most of his life in Cairo. He was a man of genuine Christian character possessing all of the christian virtues. As he moved among his fellowmen, white and colored, he shed a silent influence for the betterment of the community.

Those surviving in addition to his widow, Lula Adams Holder, are two sons, Ira A. Holder, of Buffalo, N. Y., and Horatio B. Holder, of Newark, N. J., and two grandchildren.

"Uncle Henry" as he was known to his numerous white friends, had been a regular subscriber to The Messenger since December 1904, and bore the distinction of having never missed an issue since he first subscribed.

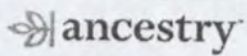

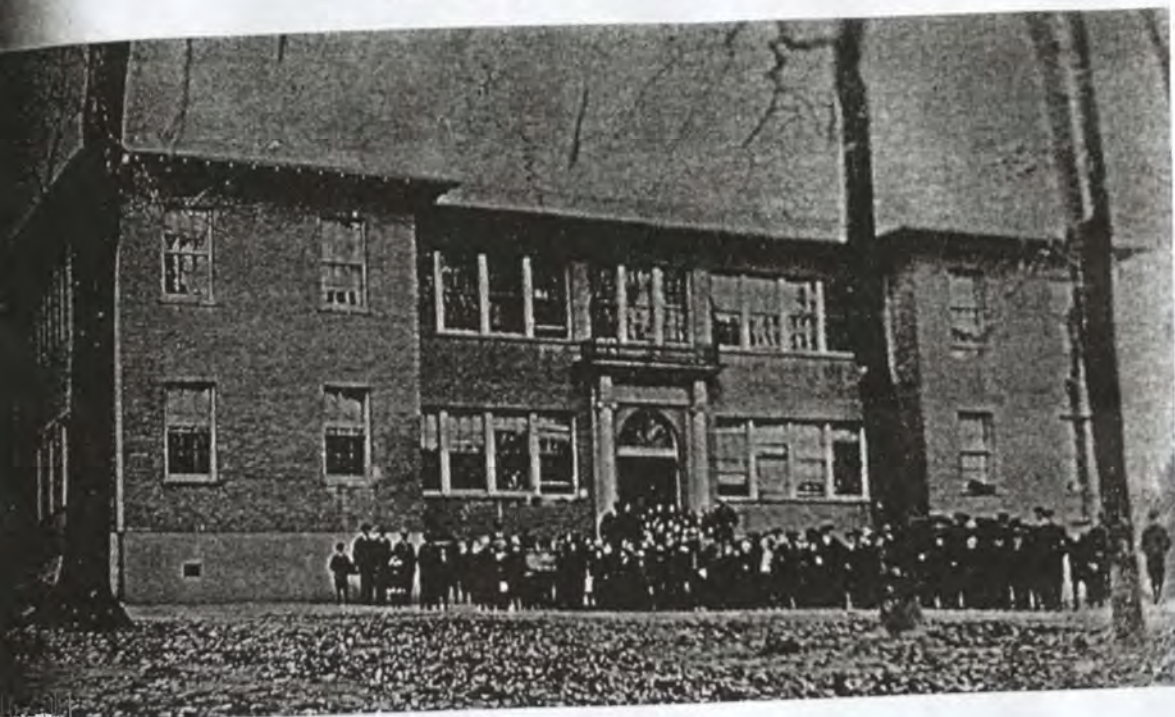

Education was not compulsory, and family economics required that many young people work rather than attend classes. Statewide, about 44 percent of the eligible white students and 26 percent of eligible black students regularly attended school.<sup>235</sup> The 1900 census named five teachers in the district outside the town limits (table 8.1). The Lewis School was six miles south of Cairo.<sup>236</sup> Pleasant Hill School, eighteen miles from Thomasville, had over sixty pupils.<sup>237</sup> In 1903, the trustees of the Cairo High School—H. H. Holder, D. J. Jones, H. F. McGriff, J. M. Rawls, and W. R. Brown—bought four acres along Maloy's Creek on the Cairo to Whigham road on which to build a schoolhouse for black students. The school was also called the Cairo Colored School.<sup>238</sup>

Although attendance was not required, and textbooks were locally chosen, the state did provide the funds for schools and legislated additions to the curriculum. In 1901, Georgia became the last of forty-five states to pass a temperance education law. The Scientific Temperance Instruction bill mandated that public schools teach about alcohol and narcotics as part of their physiology and hygiene instruction. The one-room school had officially moved beyond its core subjects as the men and women of the temperance movement enlisted the teachers in their march toward statewide prohibition.

The census reflected an increase in turpentine activity in southwest Georgia. The longleaf pines, once seen primarily as an indicator of sandy, infertile soil, had become valuable for the naval stores
