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How I Obtained My Abilities as a Psychic and Healer Lysander Xanthus

I am a professional psychic and healer. I have worked with hundreds of people, in public, online, and privately. I am often asked how a person can learn to do what I do, and I have struggled to answer. I don't believe that I could teach someone to do what I can do in a workshop or class that lasted a few days or even a few months. Many people have asked if I would teach them or offer a class. Ultimately, I have only one answer - and that answer is to do everything that I did. My healing and psychic abilities are the end result of a my lifetime of experiences and education.

In the beginning, I meditated for 30 minutes to 2 hours every night for ten years before meeting my teacher, visualizing and exploring my inner mentalscape. I wasn't starting from zero when I began my tutelage. I read the occasional book about ritual and magickal theory. I worked as an artist and an actor, which involved a variety of interesting physical and sensory exercises, some alone and some with groups of people. I believe this helped to prime me for quickly grasping metaphysical skills later on, and to be in touch with my inner emotional life, body, and tactile senses, and helped me to access my intuition in a nuanced way. I was interested in and studied many subjects such as: history, sociology, and psychology. This enriched my

understanding of the world around me and enabled me to more easily interpret spiritual happenings. So when I encountered the one who would become my teacher, and my magick studies officially began, I already had a decent education and set of life-experiences upon which to build.

The first thing that my teacher taught me was the lesson of "Know Thyself," the importance of learning who one is, not just psychologically, but as a soul, through past-lives, patron deities, astrology, numerology, self-reflection, and so much more, before engaging magick and other metaphysical skills. "Knowing Thyself" ensures that you have an anchor and a compass going forward, and that is your own sense of self. It is something I return to again and again. She then taught me how to read oracle and tarot cards as a means of self-reflection and a gentle opening into intuition. She taught me herbology and how to balance herbs in potion making, as well as choosing herbs intuitively for whatever the desired objective was. My objectives were wisdom, intuition, dream work, and emotional healing. My teacher was a psychic medium and eventually we explored spirit communication and communication with the dead.

My studies continued for the

next 8 years. I learned Magick, how to use Solomonic seals, and how to create my own seals. I studied sacred geometry and how to work with it. I learned how to lead ceremonial rituals, as well as how to cast spontaneous, structure-free spells. I learned how to make my own poppets, and how to use art to tap into intuitive and past-life information. I began channeling healings through music and dance. I learned about crystals, too, and how to do Magick without tools, and how to cast within my mind. I pushed myself to be able to communicate with spirits, all kinds of spirits gods, goddesses, demons, angels, guides, ghosts, faeries, and entities of every kind.

About three years ago I began to develop the skill of clairvoyance. Then I started energy healing, without the use of tools, only direct energy manipulation. I learned to look through the layers of the aura, to see mental as well as physical energy, to look for curses and blocks, and how to remove all of these things. I learned astrology and how to incorporate it into Magick. I have explored telepathic influence and new ways of protecting myself and my home from wandering spirits.

My skills built one upon the other, laying a strong foundation for reaching up and out for more. And through all of this, I was healing myself, and shifting into greater freedoms and higher vibrations. The Law of Attraction began to work for me. I believe that all of the hard work of studying this vast array of topics and cultivating these skills and talents led to the creation of a fantastic tapestry through which I see the world. I had no idea of what might be waiting for me when I began this path, and I am still finding new ways to surprise myself. It is important to note that I am still learning and building upon my skills every day. Everyday I am more capable. I am so grateful for my journey. I am grateful too for the fact that my choosing to commit fully to it almost a decade ago has now enabled me to help people in a unique way.

I can't teach what I do in a weekend or even in a year. When I have shared the full extent of the time which I invested into my current skill level, people are in disbelief or, sadly, discouraged. There is an expectation that you will become a master of this path in a few weeks or months, however, this is a way of life. A long path to be walked. You bring your whole life and your whole self to building these skills. There is no rush, no end to reach. You don't graduate. It has been a beautiful journey for me, and can be for you too.

Deities of Lughnasadh

Celebrated on August 1st, Lughnasadh (Lammas) is one of the eight Sabbats celebrated by Pagans (Wiccans, Druids, Heathens, Witches, Magicians, Kemetics, etc.) on the Wheel of the Year. Lughnasadh is the celebration of this first havest, Grain Harvest, a time for gathering in and giving thanks for abundance.

It is also the great festival of Lugh, the great Celtic Sun King and God of Light. August is His sacred month when He initiated grand festivities in honor of His mother, Tailtiu. Feasting, market fairs, games and bonfire celebrations were the order of the day. Circle dancing, reflecting the movement of the sun in sympathetic magic, was popular, as were all community gatherings. August was considered an auspicious month for handfastings and weddings. Underlying this is the knowledge that the bounty and energy of Lugh, of the Sun, is now beginning to wane. It is a time of change and shifts. Active growth is slowing down and the darker days of winter

and reflection are beckoning. At Lughnasadh, the Goddess is in Her aspect as Grain

Mother, and as Corn Mother represents the ripe corn of this year's harvest. Her daughter Kore/ Persephone represents the grain - the seed which drops back deep into the dark earth, hidden throughout the

winter, and re-appears in the spring as new growth. This is the deep core meaning of Lughnasadh and comes in different guises: it is about the fullness and fulfillment of the present harvest holding at its heart the seed of all future harvest. So as the grain harvest is gathered in, there is food to feed the community through the winter and within that harvest is the seed of next year's rebirth, regeneration, and harvest. The Grain Mother is ripe and full, heavily

pregnant she carries the seed of the new year's Sun God within her.

> The Sun God, Lugh, as John Barleycorn, is the living Spirit of the corn, or grain. As the corn is cut so John Barleycorn is cut down. He surrenders his life so that others may be sustained by the

grain. He is both eaten as the bread and is then reborn as the seed returns to the earth. The first sheaf of corn is supremely important, produces the first (and best) seed and assurance of future harvest. Death and rebirth; everything dies in its season. Everything is reborn; this is our whisper of immortality and the beautiful bittersweet of Lughnasadh. This Sabbat is about the cycle of birth, life, death, and rebirth -- the grain god dies but will be reborn again in the spring. Depending on your tradition, you may also observe this Sabbat as the day of the Celtic craftsman god, Lugh.

Setting up a Lughnasadh Altar

It's the end of summer, and soon the leaves will begin to change. However, the sun is still fiery and hot. Use a combination of summer and fall colors -- the yellows and oranges and reds of the sun can also represent the turning leaves to come. Add some browns and greens to celebrate the fertility of the earth and the crops being harvested. Cover your altar with cloths that symbolize the changing of the season from summer to harvest time, and use candles in deep, vibrant colors -- reds, burgundies, or other autumn shades are perfect this time of

year.

The harvest is here, and that means it's time to include symbols of the fields on your altar. Sickles and scythes are appropriate, as are baskets, sheaves of grain, freshly picked fruits, and vegetables, a jar of honey and loaves of bread are perfect for the Lammastide altar.

If your celebrations focus more on the god Lugh, observe the Sabbat from an artisan's point of view.

Place symbols of your craft or skill on the altar -- a notebook, your special paints for artists, a pen for writers, and other tools of your creativity.

The First Harvest is upon us as the God and Goddess present us with the gifts of their union. Lughnasadh - or Lammas - is a celebration of the first Grain Harvest and has wonderful traditions surrounding wheat and bread to go with it. The next Sabbat, Mabon, is the second harvest of fruit and then Samhain is the final harvest of nuts and berries.

I have a ritual that can be used by either solitary or group practitioners easily. For this one, you will need a stalk of wheat - or if there is a wheat allergy, then simply switch it out with other types of seeds - and something which you no longer wish to do; such as: bad habits or negative behaviors. Begin with anything you usually choose to do for your rituals such as: grounding, cleansing, and casting a circle. Once finished, you may close as you usually would with things such as: 'cakes and ale' and dismissing the circle. Say aloud:



The Wheel of the Year has turned once more. Today is Lammas, a time of gratitude. The harvest is upon us, We have food on our tables, and The soil is fertile. The power of the Harvest is within us. As the seeds fall to the earth and are reborn each year, We too grow as the seasons change. As the grain takes root in the fertile soil, We too will find our roots and develop. As the smallest seed blooms into a mighty stalk, We too will bloom where we land. As the wheat is harvested and saved for winter, We too will set aside that which we can use later. As the Lord sacrifices his power for the harvest, So shall I sacrifice that which no longer serves me.



No more shall I.... (State that which you no longer wish to embody)

Hold the stalks of wheat before you, rub them between your fingers so that a few grains of wheat fall, and scatter them on the ground as a gift to the earth. If you're using seeds instead, then sprinkle them on the ground.

FEATURED STONE: BOTSWANA AGATE

In geological terms, agate is a microcrystalline quartz that is deposited by silica bearing water in the cavities of other rocks. The lustrous layers you see in Botswana Agate were deposited slowly by these underground silica-rich waters in igneous, or volcanic rocks. The intricate bands were formed by repeated layers of silica falling out of solution, one layer at a time. The layers in agates can occur in any color, but in Botswana Agate, they are mostly pinks, greys, Prussian blue, eggplant and white. Metaphysically, Botswana Agate stimulates explorations of the unknown and furthers one's quest towards enlightenment. It enhances creativity and releases emotional repression. It encourages conscientiousness and vigilance. It stimulates the crown chakra, encouraging eternal love and its constancy. It removes toxins and ameliorates depression and stress.



Botswana Agate is usually found in any decently stocked rock shop or metaphysical store. Get yourself one and see if it affects you!

Oil Blends to Get us Outdoors

With summer in full swing, most of us are turning to the outdoors. From beautiful sunsets to gorgeous sunrises, camping in the woods, going to the lake, and bbqing with friends... Summer in Idaho is truly amazing. I have lived in many states and Idaho summers are by far my favorite. That is... until the bugs and allergies hit. Here are some oil blends that should help with both of those pesky irritants.

First though, here are some of my favorite oils to use:

Insect Repellent:

Lemongrass Peppermint Ylang Ylang Lavender Lime Neem TerraShield Cedarwood Purify Citronella Tea Tree (Melaleuca) Clove Rosemary Lemon Basil Geranium Thyme Eucalyptus Patchouli

Allergy helpers:

Ginger Lemon Lavender Tea Tree (Melaleuca) Frankincense Peppermint Eucalyptus Roman Chamomile Cedarwood Ylang Ylang Clary Sage Hawaiian Sandalwood Orange Marjoram Grapefruit Lime Patchouli Blue Tansy Copaiba As you can see, several of the

oils work for multi-purposes.

For the spray repellents, I recommend about 25-30 drops total, mixed with 8 oz of filtered water (normal is fine, if that's all you have) and Epsom Salt (only about ¹/₄ tsp with no fragrances or fillers). Also, If you want the blend to last longer than a week in the bottle, adding Witch Hazel (or vodka) helps keep the watersolution sanitary. Use a glass bottle with a spray top and always shake well before use. For any of the diffuser blends, blend with your favorite carrier oil and use in a diffuser or humidifier.

Also, if you are pregnant, forgo Clary Sage and use Roman Chamomile instead. Clary Sage can cause miscarriage and early labor.

These can be used in any combination, but here are some blends I like:

*Melaleuca is actually the species name of Tea Tree. Melaleuca oil is the same as tea tree.

Then step into the fire – the same fire that was once used to silence us. Let all the fear, pain, anger, and injustice burn.


Feel it's heat licking at your toes.

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

THE POWER OF PENDULUMS Understanding This Powerful Divination Tool



A pendulum is a weight that's suspended by a line from a fixed point in a way that allows it to swing freely. The name "pendulum" comes from the Latin pendulus, which means hanging down.

But the important thing about a pendulum is not that it hangs. It's that it moves.

The Movement of the Pendulum

Humanity has been fascinated by the way pendulums move since the dawn of time. It was in the early seventeenth century that Galileo Galilei investigated the regular motion of pendulums.



and how that motion can be used to mark the passage of time. To this day, many fine timepieces rely on the motion of pendulums to maintain their accuracy.

This is a monumental achievement – but it's not the only contribution pendulums have made to the way we understand and appreciate the universe we live in. In 1851, Jean Bernard Léon Foucault hung a pendulum from the dome of the Pantheon in Paris. It was 220 feet from the pivot point to where the pendulum's tip brushed against a floor of wet sand. When the pendulum was set in motion,


it took a little more than a day for a 360 degree design to appear – a pattern that proved

the rotation of the Earth, independently of any celestial observations. As fond as we are of stargazing and all things celestial, we still think that's really cool!

Pendulums & Folk Magic

Pendulums are widely used in folk magic, up until the present day and in some very surprising places.





Dowsing is the art of looking for water, minerals, or other buried items using a pendulum, dowsing rods, or other device. Homesteaders often walked their lands, pendulum in hand, looking for the best location to dig a well. When oil prospectors do this, it's often called doodlebugging. And soldiers all around the world have been known to use pendulums to help them detect land mines, unexploded ordinance and tunnels.

While scientists have not been able to confirm that the pendulum's results were any better than chance, the fact remains that when people need answers to tough questions, they turn to pendulums.

A once very common folk magic practice – occasionally still seen today! – is to create a pendulum by hanging a wedding ring from a string and letting it swing over a pregnant Mama's belly to predict the gender of the baby.

Using Pendulums Today

The pendulum can be thought of as an extension of your intuition. Believe it or not, you already know the answer to many of the questions that occupy your mind. The knowledge you seek resides within your subconscious – that portion of our mind that understands many things but communicates obliquely. The pendulum converts the knowledge of the subconscious into physical motion, making these insights much easier to access and under- stand. chain of the pendulum falling loosely past your fingers, and the pendulum point hanging freely at the bottom of its chain. Then say "Pendulum, please show me Yes." Give the pendulum time to respond, and take notice of the direction of its swing. Don't worry if the swing is only subtle to begin with.

Once you're confident on how the pendulum shows you Yes, repeat the process, asking the pendulum to show you No.

Check the Yes/No responses every time you use your pendulum. Be aware that the pendulum's Yes/No responses can change over the course of time. This is a result of your growth and development. As your subconscious changes, the messages it sends out via the pendulum will also change.

Asking Questions with the Pendulum

It is best to ask the pendulum questions about situations where you have a choice you are trying to make, where you're in control, or about things your subconscious already knows. Remember, these questions need to be Yes/No in nature, or when there are only 2 possible

Getting Started

A pendulum is a very personal tool. Be prepared to spend some time with it, as the pendulum begins to align with your vibrations.

Pendulums can best give you two possible responses – a Yes or a No. To start, hold the pendulum from the top end, with the answers.

For example, you could use your pendulum to:

• Make a choice of any kind – Do I want to travel on vacation or stay home?

• Figure out what is best to do – Should I keep the job I have or look for a new one?

- Determine how you really feel about something Do I want children in the near future?
- Assess your capabilities Can I accomplish the task I've set for myself?

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Pendulums can also be used to locate missing objects. This is great news if you lose your car keys or phone frequently. Simply ask the pendulum a series of Yes/No questions while retracing your steps. For example:

- Did I leave the keys in the car?
- Did I drop the keys in the driveway?
- Are the keys in my coat pocket?





Some pendulum users work with a map, accessing the power of their subconscious to locate water, oil, treasure, or even missing people or pets.

Pendulum Precautions

It's important to remember that the pendulum is an extension of your own intuition. It's not telling you anything you don't already know. Your pendulum works because it's in tune with your vibrations. For this reason, it's a good idea to not let anyone else handle your pendulum. If someone does handle it, spend some time with it and re-establish the Yes/No response.

Remember that the pendulum is there to help you make good decisions. It's not the only tool you have at your disposal. In addition to your intuition, engage your rational mind, and pay attention to your common sense. This combination is very powerful.

When Choosing A Pendulum

A pendulum is a very personal divination tool. Everyone is different, so there's no one sure route to finding "your" pendulum. Some people choose based on their personal affinity for a particular gemstone or symbol, while others like to try a few until they find the one that works best for them.

If you're in a pinch and making your own pendulum, here's a few tips to keep in mind: The traditional length of a pendulum is 6-9". However, you should feel

free to adapt this tradition based on the materials you have on hand, as well as the size of your hand. As long as your cord is long enough to allow the pendulum to swing freely, it's long enough.

A pendulum can be made of any material. We've found that natural materials work best – that's why we choose gemstones like clear quartz (seen at right), amethyst, smoky quartz, hematite, and rose quartz for our crystal pendulums – but you can use anything that has a bit of weight to it that you feel drawn to.

You Hold Inner Wisdom Within You

Work with intention. Using divination tools is easier when you focus on what you'd like to achieve. The role of a pendulum is to help you build your intuition and better understand what the future may hold. Keep looking forward, and you can't go wrong.

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

Tarot Signatures

There isn't some strange magic that gives a tarot signature to someone. It is just a combination of numerology and tarot using some basic math. There are many methods which allow you to use a signature, one is to find a personality card, either to represent the questioner in a reading or to use in various pathworking methods. Until now, I've been pulling these cards to use to compare the tarot to certain dates and people. I'd like to shift the column some now, to explain some interesting concepts in tarot.

We'll start with finding your own tarot signature or personality card. All you need is your birthday. For example: 03/04/21. If this were your birthday you will reduce it as follows.

03 + 04 + 2021 = 2028 2 + 0 + 2 + 8 = 12

Now take the Major Arcana of the tarot, the Suite of 22 named cards from the Fool to the World, these are numbered 0 - 21 - but for this purpose, 0 will be 22. With this birthdate, the signature card would be the Hanged Man. You then apply the meaning of this card to yourself as a person. The hanged man may be a person trying to learn something new, someone

You can use this method against any date for people or events. Using it for daily readings is one way to pick a card and apply it for that day and study it. Similar to astrology, you can do this for famous people, or certain events, to better understand how cards apply or would predict those situations or people.

There are many ways to further reduce numerological sequences in order to find other cards for other uses, including exploring the shadow, or using numerology with tarot. If you're interested here are some resources:

Q: What are some mundane things that a beginner witch might not know?

A: I think there are many housekeeping items that a beginner witch may need to know that no longer belong to the popular consciousness. While there are many tips to cover, here are a few things to help you make use of your tools for a longer period of time.

Jars

Whether they hold your favorite pickle, jam, or candle, most of us start to accumulate jars quickly. Reusing jars just makes sense. There are plenty of resources on what to do with those jars after you clean them; but, how do you clean them?

The first step with any jar is of course, to clean it. If the jar held wax, place it in the freezer for four hours. The wax will then be brittle enough to break out of the jar. You can use a butter knife for this purpose. Place the jar on a flat, stable surface. While holding the jar firmly, apply gentle pressure to the wax. The wax will crack allowing you to pull it out.

Tip: Keep jar wax to make other jar candles.

Once the wax is removed, proceed to clean the jar with hot soap and water. If you can, pull off any stickers before putting them in water. Soaking in hot water for a few hours may help loosen the label; however, you may need some steel wool to scrub the label off. To remove any sticky residue, soak a paper towel in distilled, white vinegar. Wrap the jar in the paper towel, making sure the stickum spot is covered. Leave for 30 min. Depending on the glue, you may still need to scrub the sticky spot with steel wool; but, it will be much easier. Often the stickum can be wiped off.

Colored glass jars: Unfortunately, much of the colored glass on the market is only coated - which means a good cleaning will remove the

color coating on the glass. Even gentle cleaning will scratch it, while leaving residue behind. If you are unsure if your glass is not actually colored glass, cleaning it will quickly tell you - as the color is scratched away.

Sand

It is common to use sand to disperse heat from charcoal when burning incense or to hold incense sticks. After some time, the ash and debris from the incense sticks builds up - filling the vessel. Cleaning the sand takes several steps and will keep you from having to throw out the sand itself. This is not a lossless process, and there are different stages from basic cleaning to full cleaning, where you might choose to stop.

First, take a fork and stir the ashes and sand. Lift out any large debris. Next, take the container and gently swirl the dish over a trash can. The heavier sand particles will fall to the bottom, while the ash and incense sticks rise to the top. You can scoop out the sticks using a fork.

At this point, you may want to put the sand through a sieve to remove any other incense nubs. If you are using stickless incense, you can still burn these and may want to use them completely. Finally, you can pour the sand and ash in a fine cheesecloth. Wrap the sand in a tight ball and then run under water until the water runs clear. Ash will dissolve in water and run out leaving the clean sand behind. Open the cheese cloth and spread out the sand to let it dry.

There is no harm in leaving the ash in the sand. It will still be useful to dissipate heat. Make sure you stir it from time to time to break up any large chunks and reveal any large degrees.



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
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
